William Adams & Sons - Photos of Items and Marks

In 2021 White Ironstone Notes will feature several articles on body styles and marks by the Adams firm. The first will concentrate on body styles of the 1840s to approximately 1865. While we have found some photos and marks in the WICA archives, photos for the body styles listed below are sparse.

Primary Gothic, Ca. 1840s-1850s is the earliest plain Gothic shape and was produced by at least 18 potters, including William Adams. In the WICA archives we found a child's teapot that was labeled Adams, but the mark was not included.



Classic Gothic, Ca. 1840s-1850s was also produced by W. Adams.



Adams Classic, Ca. 1850s was identified in the White Ironstone China Plate Identification Guide as being similar to Mayer's Classic. This is the only photo we have of this body style. Do



Wrapped Sydenham, Ca. Mid 1850s. What do you have in this body style, which is sometimes called Double Sydenham?



Columbia Shape, Registered 1855 was produced by several potters. While Adams is listed among the manufacturers, WICA does not have any photos of items with an Adams mark. What Adams items do you have in Columbia Shape?



Mobile Shape, Registered 1856, has an Adams mark on a ladle. Do you have any Mobile Shape items with an Adams mark?



Athenia Shape, Registered 1866, was modeled by J. T. Close & Co. References to this body style state it was also manufactured by the Adams firm. There are no photos of an Adams mark.




