Importer Kellogg & Co. of Rome, New York

Importer marks on ironstone have always fascinated Jim and Mara Kerr. So, when Jim found a Grape Octagon Shape soup tureen base with an importer's mark of "Kellogg & Co./Rome, NY," he knew it was a keeper. Not only was it a new importer's mark, but it just so happens that Mara was born in Rome, NY. In their quest to find more information, a preliminary internet search for the Kellogg name yielded no results.

Fast forward a few years later and there on Ebay came another piece with the "Kellogg & Co./Rome, NY" importer's mark. This time it was on a Gothic ewer. Although the Kerrs were not the successful high bidders, they later learned that fellow WICA member Denise Schine was the new owner!





Neither the soup tureen base nor the ewer has a maker's mark. However, the Kerrs also have a Grape Octagon vegetable tureen base with a black stamped "J. F." mark. The Grape Octagon shape was registered in 1851 by modeler Ralph Scragg. This shape has been identified as being made by many different potters. WICA's *The Illustrated Guide of White Ironstone China from A-Z* lists close to twenty makers. Each potter incorporated slight variations on the handles and finials of their pieces.





The handle on the J.F. marked vegetable tureen base can be described as having an embossed flat bunch of grapes on the panel between each of the branch handles. The top of the bunch of grapes has a twig which attaches back to the main handle. Since the soup tureen has the same handle details, the Kerrs have concluded that it was most likely made by J.F. This conclusion can further be supported in that J.F. was in business in 1851 when the shape was registered.



The Gothic ewer with the "Kellogg & Co./Rome, NY" importer's mark can also

be attributed to having been made by J.F. The thumb rest on the handle of the Rome, NY ewer is the same as on another identical Gothic shape ewer marked J.F.

















About Kellogg & Co.

Although the Kerr's initial search for information about the Kellogg & Co. was unsuccessful, a recent online search through some *Rome Daily Sentinel* newspapers from 1853 and 1854 yielded exciting finds of advertisements for the company!

Kellogg & Co. appears to have been a general merchandise store located at 67 Dominick St. in Rome, NY and sold a wide variety of items including crockery, carpets, linens, teas, clothing, sugars, molasses, oil cloths, dry goods, hardware, etc.

We know they were importing white ironstone since the October 13, 1853 advertisement states – "We are now receiving our Fall Importation of White Iron Stone China Wares.."

A Card.-We are now receiving our Fall Importations of White Iron Stone China Wares; also a general assortment of Cream Colored, Dipped and Edged, ordered from the manufacturers before the advance, all of which we offer to the trade, and guarantee prices for some first quality of goods, low as can be landed here from any market. Glass ware we sell by the package at manufacturers prices. KELLOGG & CO.

The July 15, 1853 advertisement stated "At Kellogg & Co's Crockery and Carpet Store, are 162 Tea Sets...148 Ewers and Basins, 514 Doz. assorted Plates, Dinner Sets complete, from Edward's celebrated manufactory, very cheap." Perhaps the "Edwards celebrated manufactory" mentioned in the advertisement refers to the English potter James Edwards & Son (1851-1882).

A T KELLOGG & Co'S CRUCK-ERY and Carpet Store, are 163 Ten Sots, 350 sets, 148 Ewers and Easins, 514 doz. assorted Plates Dinner Sets complete, from Edward's celebrated Manufactory, very cheap.

From the April 24, 1854 advertisement we also know that they were indeed using their name on some of these imported goods – "Second Arrival – Crockery, imported and branded Kellogg & Co."

NEW GOODS. SECOND ARRIVAL SINCE 1st INST., consisting of Carpeting, Matting, Druggetts, Oil Cloths, Foreign and Domestic Dry Goods and Groceries, Crockerv, imported and branded Keilogg & Co., of a quality good enough for Central New York, all cheaper than heretofore sold in this market. Rom., April, 1854. 2001.

Has anyone else seen other pieces with a "Kellogg & Co./ Rome, NY" importer's mark?


