Because it has been three years since WICA's last convention and convention attendees would like time to mingle with old and new members, this year's convention begins Friday, June 10, at 2:30 p.m. with a Meet and Greet, followed by a 4 p.m. presentation. To assure that you may enjoy these events without working around the hotel's 4 p.m. check-in time, you are encouraged to include Thursday evening, June 9, as part of your reservation.

Fenderz Grill and Pub, the Wyndham Garden's full-service restaurant, is open 7 a.m. to 10 a.m. for breakfast and 5 p.m. to 10 p.m. for dinner.

A complimentary continental breakfast buffet consisting of juices, assorted cereal, Danish or muffin, fruit salad, whole fruit, yogurt, granola, breads, make-your-own waffles, flavored waters, coffee, or tea is available each morning. If you would like to upgrade to a full hot breakfast, the cost is \$7.50 plus tax and gratuity. Hot breakfast selections include all the items

offered for the continental breakfast plus your choice of one of five entrees, three of which include eggs, meat, and home fries. The other two choices are (1) sausage gravy and biscuits and (2) brioche French toast.

If you would like to explore the York area before or after the convention, the daily room rates are \$119 for a room with a king bed and \$129 for a room with two queen beds. These rates are available from June 6 through June 14. The online link is limited to reservations for June 9, 10, and 11. Call the hotel at the above number to make a reservation for any other dates.

York is easily accessible by car and by air. From the city of York, the Harrisburg International Airport (MDT)) is just 30 minutes and the Baltimore/Washington International Airport (BWI) is one hour. By car it is 95 miles from York to Philadelphia, 54 miles to Baltimore, 93 miles from Washington, D.C., and 220 miles from Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania.

Through PowerPoint presentation, she will focus primarily on using her personal collection of 19th century gelatin/cream/pudding white ironstone food moulds to create period recipes made with natural food colorants. The vibrant and striking ornamental yet edible products typical of those made to impress diners at the Victorian table will be displayed on white ironstone plates and platters. Tips and advice on best practices for using white ironstone food moulds will also be addressed.

Most if not all white ironstone collectors have what is usually referred to as relish dishes—those small items in varying sizes shaped like leaves, shells, mittens, rectangles, ovals, and even rounds. Relish dishes were common on 19th century tables to hold condiments and sauces. Some relish dishes are very plain while others are elaborate. Over 350 unique shapes/designs of relish dishes have been made since the 1840's. Join Jeneen Berry as she shares some new relish dish discoveries and explores the evolution of relish dishes through the decades.
